# ICT Proposers' Day 2011

ICT Proposers' Day 2011 is organized every two years by the DG promoting Information and Communication Technologies (ICT).

Under the auspices of the Hungarian EU Presidency, the 2011 event took place in Budapest at Hungexpo fair Center from 19th to 20th May.

The event was dedicated to networking and partnership building for ICT Calls 8 and 9 of the Seventh Framework Programme of the European Commission (FP7), offering more than one billion Euros of EU funding.

Main idea of a potential project

Competencies of the proposer

# Online Networking Facilities

## Profiles of potential partners

Users provide information about themselves and their organization

## Research & technology offers

Potential partners offer their expertise in a specific domain, describe their offer and publish it on the website. Such offer can be linked to several Objectives, where it can be picked up by potential project coordinators.

## Research & technology demands

Brief description of a project idea with indication which partners with a specific expertise they are being looked for.

## Presentations

Presentation of a project idea during one of the networking sessions at the event. The presentations remain online after the event.

# Lessons Learned

The ideas generated in EECA attracted much interest

5-7 contacts after each presentation in general

Participation in ICT Proposers' Day is fruitful for establishing new contacts and exchanging ideas

High concentration of researchers and businessmen aimed at partnership building

Various networking tools

Informational support from event's web-site

An opportunity to get feedback from EC officials

# Everything is Fine, still...

The people at the event are more 'consumers of ideas', rather than 'idea generators'

Out of a dozen of contacts only 1-2 are of high value (active, competent, motivated)

Little number of 'strong players' present

Short time before the call (6 weeks)

Many successful projects start consortium building in 6-12 months before call opens

# Conclusion

The EECA participants are proactive

Detailed profiles, technology offers

High ratio of project ideas

Participation in ICT Proposers' Day is fruitful for establishing new contacts and exchanging ideas

Though there are few 'strong players'

EC officials give precious details on the objectives of the Work Programme

EECA-EU ICT cluster contributed a lot to the success of EECA Proposers
